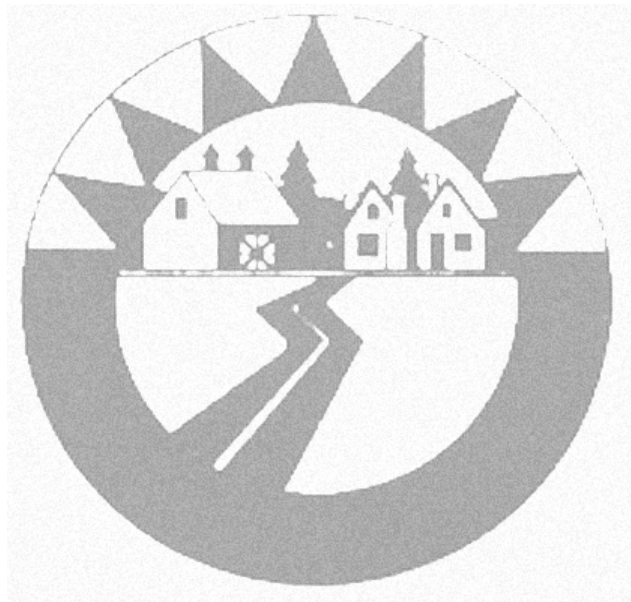
In December 2001, the Board of Supervisors approved opening the new traffic signal at Jonestown Road and Allentown Boulevard. The new state of the art signal, constructed as part of the Bradford Estates Development by Yingst Homes, Inc., has made a tremendous impact to the area in conjunction with the realignment of Jonestown Road. Approved by PENNDOT, and designed and constructed in accordance with modern intersection design standards, the traffic signal provides needed traffic control and will improve public safety at this important intersection of the Township.

Do Something NATIVE!

When you think native, do you picture an island adventure or a cruise to the Caribbean? Certainly nothing wrong with that; but when we say "native" we are talking about the plants that grew here, in our community, in our state, before European settlement. In Pennsylvania there are over 2100 species of native plants that include trees, shrubs and vines; flowers, ferns and club mosses; grasses, sedges, and rushes. Loss of native plant communities is not limited to tropical rainforests. Unfortunately, our own native plant species are being lost to habitat destruction, invasive plants, and introduced pests and plant diseases. In Pennsylvania, by the year 2000, 5 percent of our native plants had been eliminated and 25 percent were seriously threatened. "Who cares?" you ask. We all should because native plants provide food and shelter, not only for wildlife, but for people as well. They are an important part of a healthy ecosystem and enhance our community by beautifying landscapes in and around our neighborhoods. Since native plants are adapted to growing conditions in this

Over the past several weeks, the Township has received comments from residents and emergency personnel about the unsafe vehicle movements at the intersection. In particular, there have been inconsiderate drivers making "U-turns" from Allentown Boulevard that conflict with travelers entering Route 22 from Jonestown Road. There are also reports of vehicles ignoring the right turn signal controls by making "right turn on red" movements in to oncoming vehicles on Route 22. One report involved a vehicle bypassing a standing vehicle in the right turn lane and cutting off the right turn movement.

Even with the new signal, it is important for Township residents and other travelers to obey PA traffic laws. As drivers move through this intersection and others, use caution and be cautious of other crossing traffic and through traffic entering the area. The PA vehicle code addresses rules for turning movements on "standing red lights" and the use "right turn signals." Drivers should refresh themselves of these laws to avoid any unnecessary frustration during your commutes. Vehicle speeds on Route 22 are still high. While the State Police presence has improved on Route 22 and the new traffic signal has reduced speeds, every driver should take extra caution in this area to obey the signals and drive defensively.

Revised Pavilion/Facility Rental Application

The West Hanover Township Park Pavilions can be reserved and rented by residents and non-residents. The pavilions are located at Lenker Park, 7555 Manor Drive, and Fairville Park, 1000 North Fairville Avenue.

The non-refundable reservation fee is \$15.00 for residents and \$25.00 for non-residents. The reservation guarantees the use of the pavilion only and not the exclusive use of the adjacent park facilities, ball fields, tennis courts, basketball courts, volleyball court, grounds and equipment. Applications are accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis.

The Township now has a Park Facilities Application in effect. Any organization/league wishing to use the West Hanover Township courts or fields must come into the Park and Recreation Office to complete an application and pay the appropriate fees.

Individuals can also reserve the courts and fields by completing an application and paying the appropriate fees.

If interested in renting the pavilions or facilities (courts, fields, etc.), reservations must be made by contacting the Recreation Coordinator at 652-4841.

What is Rabies?

Rabies is a deadly disease caused by a virus that lives in the saliva of infected animals. It can infect all warm blooded animals, including man. In Pennsylvania the primary wild rabies vector species (RVA) are: raccoons, skunks, foxes, coyotes, groundhogs and vand bats. Unvaccinated dogs, cats and farm animals (cows, horses etc.) are also at risk. It is very rare in rabbits, squirrels, chipmunks and opossums. In Pennsylvania it is most common in the raccoon.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR: The first sign of rabies is usually a change in the animals behavior. The image of an animal frothing at the mouth and becoming overtly aggressive is most commonly associated with rabies, however, the animal may become unnaturally friendly with no fear of being approached. Baby animals with no visible teeth and apparently healthy animals can transmit the virus through their saliva. Animals, especially wild babies, are irresistible to children. Teach your children not to approach or handle wildlife; this applies to feral domestics as well (cats, dogs, etc). **VACCINATE YOUR PETS!**

WHAT IS EXPOSURE? Human exposure occurs most frequently from the bite of an infected animal. Transmission is also possible through open wounds, scratches and mucous membranes (eyes, nose, mouth). Suspect animals with valid human exposure should be tested. Quarantine and observation is **NOT** an option. The incubation period varies considerably in different species, human included.

WHAT TO DO! Call your family physician immediately. If your pets have been exposed call your veterinarian. Report wildlife exposure cases to the Pennsylvania Game Commission Regional Office at 1-877-877-9470.

Consultation services are available from the Pennsylvania Department of Health in Harrisburg. Call 787-3350. In case of emergency call 737-5349.

Conserve Water Now!

In January, due to low reservoir levels, the City of Baltimore began pumping water from the Susquehanna River in order to serve the needs of the community. Harrisburg officials have the same plan, in case it is needed. Clearly, drought conditions still exist, and are becoming worse in central Pennsylvania. Homeowners who depend upon ground water from private wells, as many do in West Hanover are especially vulnerable. Swatara Creek Watershed Association is offering free water conservation kits to anyone who successfully completes and mails in a questionnaire about ways to cut down on water use. YOGA CLASSES

Scenic Photo Tips

Harrisburg photographer Blair Seitz will give tips on taking outdoor photos, especially scenic views, at a program on April 30, 2002. 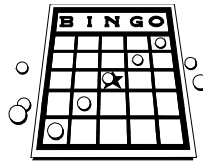
