- C. Election of Secretary/Treasurer of the Board of Supervisors (Also Res. 2017-01). **Mr. Megonnell nominated Mr. Steinmeier, seconded by Mrs. Zimmerman. The vote was unanimous.**

Mr. Steinmeier reported the gross payroll of December 22, 2017 totaled \$36,566.45 and the net payroll of \$26,532.38.

MOTION: Mrs. Zimmerman moved, seconded by Ms. Connors to approve the payroll of December 22, 2017 in the amount of \$36,566.45. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Steinmeier reported the vouchers prepaid to meet due dates were \$102,202.77.

MOTION: Ms. Connors moved, seconded by Mrs. Zimmerman to approve the vouchers prepaid to meet due dates. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Steinmeier reported the total for the vouchers to be approved is \$0.00.

Mr. Steinmeier reported the total for the vouchers to be approved and paid from Fire Tax is \$2,449.52.

MOTION: Mrs. Zimmerman moved, seconded by Mr. Miller to approve the vouchers to be paid from Fire Tax in the amount of \$6,556.35. The motion passed unanimously.

10. PLANNING COMMISSION AND ZONING REPORTS

A. Motion - #17.008 Felsburg L/SD:

Mr. Thomas Felsburg, 1517 Picketown Road presented his plan to the Board of Supervisors. Mr. Felsburg said that the plan is already being signed and notarized. Mr. Rosario read aloud the HRG Memo, dated 12/28/2017, which had four (4) items to be completed. The memo included the requested waivers, which HRG does not have an objection to. Waiver #1: Wetland Study §173-15.C(8) and waiver #2 Driveway Profile §173-15.B(3). Mr. Rosario read the four (4) items from the HRG memo: 1. A legal exhibit to accompany the description should be provided, 2. The street right-of-way width should be described in the legal description, 3. There is a discrepancy of distance in course number 6 between the plan and description, 4. The legal description does not have proper closure. Mr. Rosario stated that HRG did recommend a conditional approval upon the satisfaction of the outstanding items being corrected and approved. Mrs. Zimmerman asked what he (Mr. Felsburg) is waiting for. He replied that his engineer has not returned his calls. Mrs. Zimmerman asked how the plan was already getting signed if there were outstanding items. Mr. Rosario stated that that was a staff decision as the County comments were addressed, Ms. Hardman's comments were addressed. Mr. Rosario asked for a conditional approval to allow the plan to be cleaned up. Mr. Miller questioned what is gained by allowing this plan to have a conditional approval? Mr. Steinmeier replied that it will move it ahead; it allows for the plan to be handled in house before recording, instead of having to come out to another meeting. Mr. Miller asked if we would be relying on staff. Mr. Steinmeier said that there are minor issues to take care of. Mr. Rosario stated that only Mr. Steinmeier has signed the plans, Mr. Felsburg's engineer must get the items satisfied and approved. Mr. Megonnell

asked Mr. Felsburg when he had heard from his engineer last. Mr. Felsburg replied that it was prior to New Years, he has called, faxed but he doesn't return his calls.

MOTION: Mr. Steinmeier moved, seconded by Mrs. Zimmerman to Conditionally Approve 17.008 Felsburg SD along with the two waivers after the comments from HRG are addressed and approved. The motion passed unanimously.

K. Resolution 2018-11, Appointment of Parks & Rec board member

It was explained by Mr. Donnie Holmes that the Parks & Rec board is actually fully staffed, and they would like this resolution tabled. It was discussed that the plan is to move their alternate to a permanent position and remove seat #4, as they do not attend meetings. It will be discussed further under Other Business.

L. Resolution 2018-12, Appointment of Planning Commission Members

Mr. Megonnell would like to know what the Planning Commission thinks. It was verified that the Planning Commission has not seen the application. MOTION: Mr. Megonnell moved, seconded by Mr. Steinmeier to table this appointment until the Board has received feedback from the Planning Commission. The motion passed unanimously.

M. Resolution 2018-13, Appointment of PSAB Citizen at Large

MOTION: Ms. Connors moved, seconded by Mr. Steinmeier to appoint Jay Megonnell to the Public Safety Advisory Board (PSAB) Advisory Board as the "liaison" for 2018. The motion passed unanimously. The Township still needs a "citizen at large"

N. Resolution 2018-14, Appointment of the Water & Sewer Authority Member

P. Resolution 2018-16, Appointment of the SCEMS Representative

MOTION: Mrs. Zimmerman moved, seconded by Mr. Megonnell to appoint Todd Hoffman to serve on the SCEMS Board for 2018. The motion passed unanimously.

Q. Resolution 2018-17, Appointment to Dauphin County Tax Collection Committee

Mr. Megonnell nominated Mr. Steinmeier, who declined. MOTION: Mr. Megonnell moved, seconded by Ms. Connors to appoint Mr. Rosario as the delegate and Donald Steinmeier as the alternate delegate for appointment to the Dauphin County Tax Collection Committee for 2018. The motion passed unanimously.

R. Resolution 2018-18, Appointment to Cap COG

There was discussion that a full-time representative is needed. Mr. Megonnell stated that he would take the alternate representative position, but did not want to do it full-time. Mrs. Zimmerman said that meetings are once a month and asked Mr. Chiles if he would like to be the representative. Mr. Chiles replied no, he wants to be at these meetings. MOTION: Mrs. Zimmerman moved, seconded by Ms. Connors to table this resolution until a later date. The motion passed unanimously.

S. Resolution 2018-19, Appointment to W.E.S. Business Association

Mr. Megonnell nominated Mrs. Zimmerman, who declined. MOTION: Mrs. Zimmerman nominated Mr. Steinmeier to serve on the W.E.S. Business Association and Ms. Hardman as alternate for 2018. Mr. Megonnell seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

T. Resolution 2018-20, Compensation for the Zoning Hearing Board and Water & Sewer Authority Board

There was discussion over why the Water & Sewer Authority Board is included on our agenda, as they pass their own motions. It was unclear why we were debating their compensation as they receive \$100 per meeting. It was asked if the compensation for them is out of the Township funds – Mr. Steinmeier replied no, it comes from the Sewer Authority funds. MOTION: Mrs. Zimmerman moved, seconded by Mr. Steinmeier to keep the compensation the same as listed for the 2018 year. The motion passed unanimously.

U. Resolution 2018-21, Appointment of Depository for Township Funds

Mr. Megonnell stated that we should keep the current schedule of nine (9) holidays plus the two (2) personal days. Mrs. Zimmerman stated that she would like to add Election Day to the holidays. Mr. Steinmeier said he only believes that the presidential elections are big; all the other years do not have a large turnout. Ms. Connors asked how much disruption there was. Mr. Rosario replied that we work with our doors closed, cannot walk across the middle of the room, and it is hard to get to the copy room to do business.
MOTION: Mrs. Zimmerman moved to add Election Day as a tenth (10th) holiday. The vote was 2-3, with the holiday schedule being kept the same.

BB. Resolution 2018-28, Mileage Reimbursement

*It was questioned what the federal rate was – 54.5¢ per mile. **MOTION: Mr. Megonnell moved, seconded by Ms. Connors to use the current Federal rate for mileage. The motion passed unanimously.***

CC. Resolution 2018-29, Appointment of the Assistant Fire Marshall

*Mrs. Zimmerman asked if their compensation was the same – it was confirmed that the Assistant Fire Marshall receives \$250/year. **MOTION: Mrs. Zimmerman moved, seconded by Mr. Megonnell to appoint Justin Wolford at \$250/year for the two-year term of Assistant Fire Marshall. The motion passed unanimously.***

DD. Resolution 2018-30, Appointment of the Fire Marshall

*Mrs. Zimmerman asked if their compensation was the same – it was confirmed that the Fire Marshall receives \$500/year. **MOTION: Mrs. Zimmerman moved, seconded by Mr. Megonnell to appoint Todd Hoffman at \$500/year for the four-year term of Fire Marshall. The motion passed unanimously.***

EE. Resolution 2018-31, Emergency Operation Plan

*Mr. Rosario stated that this is reviewed every two years and submitted to the County. It includes a directory that is available only to emergency partners, and is not available to the general public. Mr. McCahan started the Township on this and the County seems happy with the plan. **MOTION: Mr. Megonnell moved, seconded by Ms. Connors to continue the Emergency Operation Plan for 2018. The motion passed unanimously.***

FF. Resolution 2018-32, T-601 Bridge Replacement with Lower Paxton Township

*It was asked if this is “the bridge”- Mr. Rosario replied yes and hopefully there should be movement on this by summer. Mr. Rosario stated that Lower Paxton is in charge of it, and they are funding it, but we do have some money in the budget for this if something does come up. **MOTION: Mrs. Zimmerman moved, seconded by Mr. Megonnell to renew the resolution for 2018. The motion passed unanimously.***

GG. Resolution 2018-33, Wireless Infrastructure Deployment Bill

*Ms. Connors recommended that the Township actually “follow through” with each of the people listed, as it makes a greater impact that just sending the resolution off. **MOTION: Ms. Connors moved, Mr. Megonnell seconded the motion to oppose the House Bill 1620 (PN2146) entitled the “Wireless Infrastructure Deployment Bill”. The motion passed unanimously.***

13. OTHER BUSINESS THAT MAY COME BEFORE THE BOARD

- A. Mr. Rosario asked about setting up a meeting for the Houck Manor/ Holiday Park residents so that we can gather information / do study to see what would be required. DEP are the only ones who can rescind the sewer mandate. This study would include every well, every on-lot system to be inspected. This study would require 100% participation of the residents, or it could not be done. Mr. Rosario wants to know if the Board would allow him to set up a meeting. Mrs. Zimmerman asked, wasn't a study already done? Holiday Park is already in the current study, but Houck Manor has never been included in any study or looked at. Mr. Rosario stated that the meeting would be to find out what they need in order to pass DEP's requirements. We would be paying for the Township SEO and HRG time, but nothing additional. Mr. Steinmeier had some comments including that water & Sewer should be involved in this process. Mr. Rosario stated that he is hoping for Gaming Grant money. Mr. Steinmeier did not have faith in the gaming grant money. Mr. Steinmeier said that one thing to keep in mind is that both Houck Manor and Holiday Park probably do not meet the standard code; and most of the area is probably sub-standard septic or cesspools. The laws did not regulate this until 1972, prior to that there were very little or no standards. When they knew the state laws were coming, there was some effort, but anything could be called septic. Mrs. Zimmerman said that there are two types of people: the grasshoppers who lived for the moment and did not prepare or save for this and the ants, who have saved and are ready. It was asked if this was on the December Board meeting, Mr. Rosario said yes, but he wanted to see what this Board's opinion was. Ms. Connors stated that a lot of items were tabled in the last few meetings so that the "new" board could make those decisions. Mr. Rosario repeated that he would like to have the criteria, is this a viable consideration or no. It was discussed who would be at the meeting if it were to be scheduled. The decision was: Brian & Carrie McFeaters, HRG, Water & Sewer, Mr. Rosario. It was made clear that if the meeting happened, any additional funding would need prior approval by the Board of Supervisors. Ms. Connors would like to be able to say to the public – We did this for you, we tried, this is what we have to show you. ***MOTION: Ms. Connors moved, seconded by Mr. Megonnell to approve Mr. Rosario to have a single meeting with the above mentioned people and conditions. The vote was 4-1 with Mr. Steinmeier opposed.***
- B. Mr. Rosario stated that there will be a workshop on Monday, January 8th to discuss the RFP for the trash hauler for the Township. The contract expires in June and if we are to "shop" we should start soon.
- C. Mr. Holmes, Parks & Recreation, stated that in a meeting on October 18, 2017 the Parks & Recreation board voted to remove Marc Ehnot, as he does not attend any meetings. Mr. Holmes said that when this came before the BOS prior, Mr. Klein wanted him to reach out and contact Mr. Ehnot. Mr. Holmes has, but has not received a letter from him. ***MOTION: Mrs. Zimmerman moved, seconded by Mr. Megonnell to remove Mr. Ehnot from the Parks & Recreation Board. The motion passed unanimously.***

Mr. Holmes would also like to have permission to move Jenifer Bowers from the alternate seat to the seat Mr. Ehnot had. Then they would just need to find an additional alternate for the board. ***MOTION: Mrs. Zimmerman moved, seconded by Mr. Miller to move Jennifer Bowers from the alternate seat to Seat #4. The motion passed unanimously.***

Mr. Holmes stated that the Winter Wonderland Ball is on January 26th, there is a make and take Valentine's Day Card, and the new e-newsletter has just went out.

14. PUBLIC COMMENT

- A. Mr. Mark Chiles, 228 Brookridge Court – Mr. Chiles asked why the Discussion- Townes at Hershey Road, Stormwater and Road Issues was removed from the agenda tonight? Mr. Rosario stated that he removed it because there was no new news and tonight is mainly a reappointment meeting. Mr. Chiles was assured that it will be on the next agenda and every agenda thereafter unless a resolution is reached. Mr. Chiles stated that he is asking for a status, he would like to schedule a workshop either the next BOS meeting, or the first in February so that the HOA for Townes of Hershey won't be in the dark and everyone can get information at the same time. Mr. Miller stated it would be scheduled during a workshop, not a meeting. Mr. Rosario said that we still have to meet with HRG and get their feedback. Mrs. Zimmerman moved, seconded by Mr. Megonnell to tentatively schedule the workshop with the Townes of Hershey for February 12, 2018 at 6 pm. Mr. Chiles agreed.
- B. Mr. Richard Enck, 7112 Hillside Road – wanted to tell the Board “thank you” for considering the meeting. Mr. Enck said that he understands that HRG, DEP and the Township SEO may be doing testing. He thinks it was wrong how this has been handled. Mr. Steinmeier stated that the Sewer Authority did not have the money when it came up, as they just completed a seven million dollar expansion to the Sewer Plant. Mrs. Zimmerman can understand what the people are saying, and does not have any objections to their feelings, but she was the one that asked for the five-year extension. The new DEP deadline is 2021. Mr. Enck stated that the process has been frustrating. He stated that they were told five thousand dollars, now they are being told fifty thousand dollars! Mr. Enck said that the houses are not worth that much over there, that fifty thousand dollars would be half the value of some of the homes. It was mentioned that the current numbers were thirty-two thousand per house, the Water & Sewer would spend cash on the project, and they may be able to lower the cost, perhaps under ten thousand per house. Mr. Steinmeier asked where the numbers came from; Mr. Enck replied that the last session that the WSA meeting, that is where they are from. Mr. Enck said that there are sixty units there, there is no way they can output that kind of money. Mr. Steinmeier reminded Mr. Enck that the residents over there are getting a grinder pump for free. Mr. Enck said that the homeowners are responsible for those pumps, they are not very reliable. He said – what about that house at the corner of Piketown & Pheasant? They are at the lowest point, if a check valve fails, where is all that going? Mr. Steinmeier said that a grinder pump will last 15-20 years and have two inch pipes.
- C. Mr. George Kirk, 839 Shawnee Dr. – Mr. Kirk said that there are lots of numbers being thrown around. The people need clarity on what they are going to have save/finance for. Mr. Kirk stated that a lot of people feel they are being bullied into hooking up to sewer. Mr. Steinmeier said for example, if an engineer gives a figure of \$4,400 in the street, from the street to the house is the homeowner's responsibility.
