BURN PERMIT REMINDER

Residents are reminded that a Burn Permit is necessary anytime you want to burn on your property. The permits are only valid for one burn. Each individual burn requires a new, signed permit. The permit has been updated and you should allow 10 days for your permit to be processed before you can burn.

Updated permits can be found at the Township Building and on the Township website: www.westhanover.com.

If caught without a permit, or burning items that are not allowed, you can be subject to legal action and fines.

COMPOST CENTER OPENS SATURDAY, MARCH 28

The Compost Center is located at 402 N. Fairville Avenue and will be open to residents with a permit on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. **beginning Saturday, March 28, 2020.**

Annual permits are only available at the Township Building, 7171 Allentown Boulevard or online. The cost for an annual permit is \$30 and a 1-day permit is \$10.

E-CYCLING CENTER

The E-cycling Center, also located at 402 N. Fairville Avenue is open year-round, Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. You can simply leave your electronic item near the E-cycling shed and a Public Works crew member will put it where it needs to be. There is only an attendant there to help with unloading items during Compost Center hours. You can also drop-off electronic items on Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. when the Compost Center is open.

MS4 UPDATE

MS4 and stormwater related projects are important to the community because they lessen the potential for flooding during and after rain events and reduce the amount of pollutants entering our local waterways. MS4 projects, often referred to as Best Management Practices, or BMPs, come in many forms including vegetative swales, bioretention basins, infiltration facilities, rain gardens, streambank stabilization, and riparian buffer restoration. Each variety of BMP serves to reduce the amount of stormwater runoff and/or improve the water quality of the stormwater runoff. Implementing stormwater BMPs is not only beneficial to our local creeks and streams, it also improves the condition of downstream receiving waters such as the Chesapeake Bay.

In 2020, the Township will implement a stormwater utility fee to help fund stormwater related projects and programs throughout the Township. The stormwater utility fee is a monthly user fee collected from businesses, churches, schools and homeowners to help subsidize the substantial cost of operation, maintenance and improvements to the existing storm sewer system and facilities

The Township in partnership with HRG (Herbert, Rowland & Grubic, Inc.) will be performing Stormwater BMP inspections for residential and commercial properties in the Township beginning February, 2020. BMP inspections are required by PADEP to ensure existing stormwater facilities remain in place and maintained to ensure proper operating performance. Property owners will be notified of any deficiencies found during the BMP inspection. Proper operation and maintenance of private stormwater facilities and BMPs is a critical component of the Township's overall approach to stormwater management.

TIPS TO REDUCE STORMWATER POLLUTION IN THE WINTER

Tips to Reduce Stormwater Pollution in the Winter

- > Dispose of snow in vegetated areas; avoid dumping it into the streets, Inlets, or streams
- > Use safe and effective alternatives to salt for ice prevention, such as sand or kitty litter.
- > Once snow and ice has melted and dried, remove excess salt from paved areas.
- > Salts are typically ineffective at melting ice once air temperatures drop below 15 degrees.
- > Report large, uncovered stockpiles of deicing salt to the Township at 717-652-4841

ILLICIT DISCHARGE

Any discharge to the Township's storm sewer system that is not composed entirely of stormwater, or a PADEP approved non-stormwater discharge shall be considered an illicit discharge.

First Time Home Buyers Program

Dauphin County Department of Community & Economic Development (DCDCED) has \$3,0000 available to first time home buyers to help with closing costs or down payments. This is a no interest loan that is to be repaid when the home is sold to another owner. Applications are available year-round and there is no deadline for submission, but there is a 4 to 5 week processing time for the application. More details can be found at www.dauphincounty.com, then clicking on Government and selecting Community & Economic Development (located under the Support Services heading).

Small Business Loan Program

Economic Development Small Business Loan Program can be used by both new businesses and existing businesses that need assistance for expansion. Applications are available year-round and there is no deadline for submission. Such businesses must be able to create jobs for lower income persons with limited job skill requirements. Loans can be made for the acquisition and rehabilitation or new construction for non-residential properties, or purchase of equipment or machinery. Loans may not be used to refinance existing debt nor for working capital.

Roof Mounted Solar Panels

As roof mounted solar panels are becoming more and more popular, I would like to remind you that in case of a fire at your home, and the Firefighters need to make a hole in your roof in order to fight a blaze, the Township and Fire Company is not responsible for any damage done to the roof mounted solar panels. Placement of roof mounted solar panels is critical for safety of all persons.

At a recent meeting, the West Hanover Lions Club welcomed two more new members, Paul Potteiger and Carol Wirth.



Guidelines for Sewage Grinder Pumps

With the new sewage extension project completed in Houck Manor, we felt that now would be a good time to remind the residents of the township who rely on sewage grinder stations of some of the do's and don'ts of their pumping systems. Although these stations are robust, treating them properly will help to extend the life of the grinder stations and ensure many years of uninterrupted service. Below is a list of some of the items to keep in mind:

DO

1. Twice annually, remove the cover from your station and spray the interior with a garden hose. By washing down the walls and floats, you'll be sure to keep everything inside free of debris and operating properly.
2. Keep the area around your station clear of obstructions so that in the event of your having to open it, it is easily accessible.
3. Always be sure to keep the lid bolted on tightly unless you are performing maintenance in order to keep children and pets safe!

DON'T

1. Rinse cooking grease down the drain. As it cools, grease will coat pipes as well as the components of your station causing it to not perform properly. Dispose of cooking grease in waste receptacles after it has cooled.
2. Avoid flushing ANY of the following:
 - a. Glass, plastic and metal.
 - b. Baby wipes and "Flushable" wipes. They are NOT flushable and can cause major issues later on.
 - c. Sanitary napkins, condoms, diapers rags, etc. Dispose of these items in your waste receptacles.
 - d. Toilet bowl scrub pads.
 - e. Cat litter.
 - f. Dental floss and hair.
 - g. Food seeds and peels.
 - h. Any vitamins, medicines or needles. Dispose of these at your local drugstore in approved receptacles.
 - i. Explosives or flammable material oil, gasoline and paint thinner.
 - j. Strong household cleaners.

As always, if you aren't certain about something or if you have any questions, please feel free to contact the Sewer Authority with your questions and we will do our best to answer them.

HOLIDAY PARK SEWER EXTENSION PROJECT UPDATE

Residents will need to apply for a Building Permit from the Township. The permit is on the Township website or can be picked up at the Township Building. Once completed, the permit will need to be submitted to the Township, along with construction plans (provided by your contractor) that outlines the scope of the project. These plans must comply with the 2015 International Residential Code (IRC). If financing, residents may contact the PA Housing Finance Agency (funded by PENNVEST) at 855-827-3466 or visit www.phfa.org to learn more and view a list of participating lenders.

KNOW YOUR CONTRACTOR BY MARK SALISBURY, MANAGER, WHT SEWER AUTHORITY

The Holiday Park sewer extension project will get underway in the near future. As you plan your sewer connection, choosing the right contractor for the job is a critical first step in the process. Get at least three quotes for the work you need to have performed, and be sure that each quote is for the exact same work. You'll want to make sure you do the following:

- Verify the quality of the contractor's work in advance
- Spell out in writing what work you want performed
- Agree upon the scope of the project
- Verify and request proof that the contractor is properly licensed and insured in the event something goes wrong
- Be sure to get everything in writing.



What's on your spring cleaning list? Organizing the pantry? Putting together a big donation of gently used clothes? When it comes to refreshing your environment (and life) this spring, don't forget these important health and safety reminders:

Medicine

It's time to go through the medicine cabinet and [clean out old, unused and expired products](#) and prescriptions.

Did you know that flushing medicine down the toilet or simply tossing it in the trash isn't always the best way to dispose of it? For pills, capsules and liquids where the box does not describe instructions for disposal, follow FDA guidelines:

- Empty the medicine into a re-sealable bag.
- (Optional) Add dish soap and a little water to pills and capsules to help them dissolve.
- Place a scoop of kitty litter, coffee grounds or dirt to absorb the liquid.
- Throw in the trash.

If you have unused prescriptions, you may want to instead take them to the State Police lobby on Bretz Drive to dispose of them.

Don't forget to remove the prescription label or mark out any personal information before you recycle or give back pill bottles.

Home Safety

Spring cleaning plays an important role in fall prevention as you take extra care in eliminating clutter and other potential trip hazards, which is great. But what about outside the house – are the railings on your outdoor decks or porches sturdy? Are sidewalks, doorsteps and ramps up to the house clear of leaves and debris? Is there non-slip adhesive to prevent slipping and falling? Remember these important places too! Finally, don't forget fire prevention when it comes to home safety this spring. Make sure to:

- Check that your fire extinguisher is charged, not expired and accessible.
- Test smoke and CO₂ detectors for live and active batteries.
- Remove fire hazards from around the dryer (like clothes, cardboard boxes, lint, etc.).
- Properly clean the barbecue grill and make sure it's not sitting under any overhanging structure (like a carport or balcony) when in use.
- If you use a propane grill, check the line for leaks or breaks.
- Clear built-up debris, leaves and dead vegetation from around the house.
- Empty the garage of common fire starters like old newspapers, boxes, etc.

First Aid

Is your first aid kit stocked and ready to use in the event of an emergency? If not, add it to your spring cleaning checklist. In addition to first aid basics like band-aids, gauze, antibiotic ointment, wound solution and alcohol swabs, don't forget elastic bandages, scissors, tweezers, anti-itch cream, an instant cold compress, antihistamine tablets, and over-the-counter pain relievers.

You may additionally have a home health kit that includes all your [devices for checking vitals](#) like a thermometer and [blood pressure monitor](#).

Update your own and your loved one's lists of current medications including name, dosage and frequency and post them somewhere visible, like in the bathroom or kitchen.

You can also take this time to update the Medical ID information in your smartphone. Most iPhones and Androids have a health app now where you can save your name, birth date, allergies, health conditions, blood type and medication list.

In the event you are hurt or ill and unable to speak, emergency responders are commonly trained to check your phone for this information – it is designed so they can access it from the lock screen without having to know your passcode.
